- 1. MATTHEW (A.D. 53)
 - (1) Destination: the Jews
 - (2) Purpose: To present Jesus as the Messiah
 - (3) Symbol: Lion (strength, kingship)
 - (4) Focus: on the Past / sets forth the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy
 - (5) Span: opens with Genealogy; closes with Resurrection
- 2. MARK (A.D. 69)
 - (1) Destination: the Romans
 - (2) Purpose: to present Jesus as the Servant
 - (3) Symbol: Ox (lowliness, service)
 - (4) Focus: on the Present / manfests life and activity congenial to the Roman mind
 - (5) Span: opens with Jesus' public ministry; closes with His ascension.
- 3. LUKE (A.D. 58)
 - (1) Destination: the Greeks
 - (2) Purpose: to present Jesus as Man
 - (3) Symbol: Man (intelligence, personality) the highest order in Creation
 - (4) Focus: on the Future / sets for universal and comprehensive character of the Gospel
 - (5) Span: opens with the birth of John the Baptist; closes with promise of the Holy Spirit.
- 4. JOHN (A.D. 85)
 - (1) Destination: the Church
 - (2) Purpose: to present Jesus as God
 - (3) Symbol: Eagle (heavenliness, mystery, divinity)
 - (4) Focus: on Eternity / presents the Gospel in its absolute perfection as related to the Father in eternity.
 - (5) Span: opens with eternity; closes with Christ's Second Coming
- 5. ACTS (A.D. 62)
 - (1) Destination: Theophilus ("lover of God")
 - (2) Purpose: to account for the origin, nature, founding and growth of the Church
 - (3) Emphasis: Witnessing (1:8)
 - (4) Development: (following 1:8)
 - A. Jerusalem (1-7)
 - B. Judea and Samaria (8-12)
 - C. The uttermost parts (13:-28)
 - (5) Span: from the Ascension to Paul's Roman Imprisonment (covering 30 years)
